

Tiger mosquitoes – avoid standing water!

Stop the tiger mosquito!



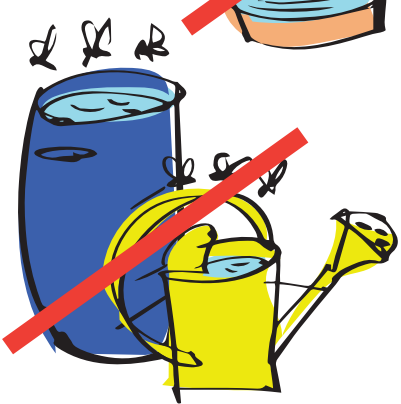
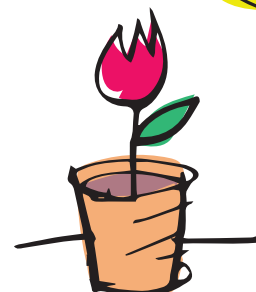
The tiger mosquito is day-active and very aggressive – and has arrived in our region. It can potentially transmit diseases. Tiger mosquitoes place their eggs and larvae in standing water. Therefore: no water or frequently changed water reduces its spread.



Avoid containers with standing water



Remove trivets or empty them regularly



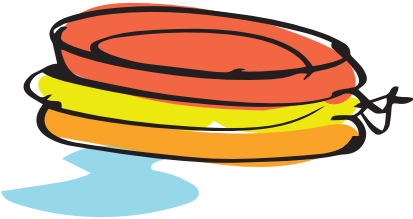
Cover rain barrels and make sure that there is no standing water on the cover. Turn watering cans upside down



Dispose of any rubbish immediately or keep it in a well covered container



Regularly change the water in paddling pools. Biotopes are excluded from this rule : they contain mosquito predators



After all the work is done: enjoy the warm weather without tiger mosquitoes !
